DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:

• Canopy Removal at the Portland Transportation Center conforming to the requirements of this Request for Quotes and the attached Specifications.

PROJECT INFORMATION, SCHEDULE REQUIREMENTS, AND OTHER INFORMATION:

- The work of this contract includes removal of the existing fiberglass canopy from the Amtrak Downeaster passenger loading platform, and other associated work at the Portland Transportation Center (PTC), as described below and in the attached Plans and Specifications.
- The Contractor shall procure and maintain, at its sole cost and expense, the following insurance coverages naming the Northern New England Passenger Rail Authority ("NNEPRA") as insured, in forms and with companies and coverage limits satisfactory to NNEPRA. Concord Coach and Langdon Street Reality shall be named as additional insured.
 - o Comprehensive General Liability Insurance protecting against liability from bodily injury or property damage arising out of the Project.
 - o Workers Compensation and Occupational Disease Insurance, as required by law.
 - Automobile Liability Insurance covering all motor vehicles used about or in connection with the Project.
- All work for this contract shall be completed no later than November 30, 2024.

Canopy Removal at the Portland Transportation Center

- The removal of the existing canopy at the Portland Transportation Center shall be completed in accordance with the attached NNEPRA Construction Specifications for Canopy Removal at the Portland Transportation Center, and other miscellaneous attachments.
- The passenger platform is located adjacent to the active railroad right-of-way owned by CSX Transportation, and all work will be conducted under the protective oversight and authority of CSX onsite personnel.
- The Downeaster provides daily scheduled passenger service to the platform, and all overhead
 work will be required to temporarily cease during each scheduled stop for loading/unloading
 passengers. Typically, between 7am 7pm each day, the passenger train will be at the
 platform six (6) times within that time frame, and only dwells at the platform for 5-8 minutes
 each stop.
- The removal of the existing canopy at the Portland Transportation Center will generally consist of the following work:
 - o Mobilizing to the site and demobilizing from the site.
 - Supplying and maintaining barrier devices for partial closure of the active passenger rail platforms while demolition and construction is occurring.

- Removing and properly disposing of the existing fiberglass canopy and steel spline members supporting the canopy. After removal of the existing canopy, a cap shall be installed on the top of each of the existing support columns.
- o Adjusting the existing light fixtures attached to the existing canopy support columns.
- Rerouting and installing support for the existing flexible conduit that contains video camera data cable that currently extends from the trainway roof, across the top of the canopy, and down to the video camera that is attached to the adjacent supporting column for the existing canopy.

(the "Master Agreement") by virtue of Contractor/Vendor's participation in the Project.

No Government Obligation to Third Parties. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that, notwithstanding any concurrence by the Federal Government in or approval of the solicitation or award of the underlying Contract, absent the express written consent by the Federal Government, the Federal Government is not a party to this Contract and shall not be subject to any obligations or liabilities to the Recipient, Contractor or any other party (whether or not a party to that contract) pertaining to any matter resulting from the underlying Contract. The Contractor agrees to include the above clause in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by the FTA. It is further agreed that the clause shall not be modified, except to identify the subcontractor who will be subject to its provisions.

Resolution of Disputes, Breaches, or Other Litigation – Notification of Contractor and/or Subcontractor to Agency and Agency Notification to FTA

If a current or prospective legal matter that may affect the Federal Government emerges, the Recipient must promptly notify the FTA Chief Counsel and FTA Regional Counsel for the Region in which the Recipient is located. The Recipient must include a similar notification requirement in its Third-Party Agreements and must require each Third Party Participant to include an equivalent provision in its sub-agreements at every tier, for any agreement that is a "covered transaction" according to 2 C.F.R. §§ 180.220 and 1200.220.

- (1) The types of legal matters that require notification include, but are not limited to, a major dispute, breach, default, litigation, or naming the Federal Government as a party to litigation or a legal disagreement in any forum for any reason.

This responsibility occurs whether the Project is subject to this Agreement or another agreement between the Recipient and FTA, or an agreement involving a principal, officer, employee, agent, or Third-Party Participant of the Recipient. It also applies to subcontractors at any tier. Knowledge, as used in this paragraph, includes, but is not limited to, knowledge of a criminal or civil investigation by a Federal, state, or local law enforcement or other investigative agency, a criminal indictment or civil complaint, or probable cause that could support a criminal indictment, or any other credible information in the possession of the Recipient.

Program Fraud. Contractor recognizes that the requirements of the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986, as amended, 31 U.S.C. §§ 3801 et seq., and U.S. DOT Regulations, "Program Fraud Civil Remedies," 49 C.F.R. Part 31, apply to its actions hereunder. Accordingly, by signing the Agreement, Contractor certifies and affirms the truthfulness and accuracy of any statement it has made, it makes, or may make pertaining to the activities covered hereunder. In addition to other penalties that may be applicable, Contractor also acknowledges that if it makes false, fictitious or fraudulent claims, statements, submissions, assurances, or certifications, the Federal Government reserves the right to impose the penalties of the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986, as amended, on Contractor to the extent the Federal Government deems appropriate.

Contractor recognizes that if Contractor makes a false, fictitious, or fraudulent claim, statement, submission, certification, assurance, or representation to the Federal Government of includes a false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation in any agreement with the Federal Government in connection with a project authorized under 49 U.S.C. chapter 53 or any other federal law, the Federal Government reserves the right to impose on Contractor the penalties of 49 U.S.C. § 5323(1), 18 U.S.C. § 1001 or other applicable federal law to the extent the Federal Government deems appropriate.

The Contractor agrees to include the above two clauses in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FTA. It is further agreed that the clauses shall not be modified, except to identify the subcontractor who will be subject to the provisions.

Access to Records and Reports.

Record Retention. The Contractor will retain, and will require its subcontractors of all tiers to retain, complete and readily accessible records related in whole or in part to the contract, including, but not limited to, data, documents, reports, statistics, leases, subcontracts, arrangements, other third party Contracts of any type, and supporting materials related to those records. (a) A bid guarantee from each bidder equivalent to five percent of the bid price. The "bid guarantee" must consist of a firm commitment such as a bid bond, certified check, or other negotiable instrument accompanying a bid as assurance that the bidder will, upon

acceptance of the bid, execute such contractual documents as may be required within the time specified.

<u>Retention Period</u>. The Contractor agrees to comply with the record retention requirements in accordance with 2 C.F.R. § 200.334. The Contractor shall maintain all books, records, accounts and reports required under this Contract for a period of at not less than three (3) years after the date of termination or expiration of this Contract, except in the event of litigation or settlement of claims arising from the performance of this Contract, in which case records shall be maintained until the disposition of all such litigation, appeals, claims or exceptions related thereto.

<u>Access to Records</u>. <u>Federal Changes.</u> Contractor shall at all times comply with all applicable FTA regulations, policies, procedures and directives, including without limitation those listed directly or by reference in the Master Agreement between Purchaser and FTA, as they may be amended or promulgated from time to time during the term of this contract. Contractor's failure to so comply shall constitute a material breach of this contract.

<u>Civil Rights Laws and Regulations.</u> The Contractor and any subcontractor agree to comply with all the requirements prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin of the Title VI of the Civil Rights Action of 1964, as amended 52 U.S.C 2000d, and U.S. DOT regulation "Nondiscrimination in Federally-Assisted Programs of the Department of Transportation – Effectuation of the Title VI of the Civil rights Act, "49 C.F. The Agency is an Equal Opportunity Employer. As such, the Agency agrees to comply with all applicable Federal civil rights laws and implementing regulations. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with applicable Federal implementing regulations and other implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- 2. Race, Color, Religion, National Origin, Sex. In accordance with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e et seq., and Federal transit laws at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable equal employment opportunity requirements of U.S. Department of Labor (U.S. DOL) regulations, "Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, Equal Employment Opportunity, Department of Labor," 41 C.F.R. chapter 60, and Executive Order No. 11246, "Equal Employment Opportunity in Federal Employment," September 24, 1965, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e note, as amended by any later Executive Order that amends or supersedes it, referenced in 42 U.S.C. § 2000e note. The Contractor agrees to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, national origin, or sex

(including sexual orientation and gender identity). Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, promotion, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

- 3. Age. In accordance with the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, 29 U.S.C. §§ 621634, U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (U.S. EEOC) regulations, "Age Discrimination in Employment Act," 29 C.F.R. part 1625, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 6101 et seq., U.S. Health and Human Services regulations, "Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Age in Programs or Activities Receiving Federal Financial Assistance," 45 C.F.R. part 90, and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees to refrain from discrimination against present and prospective employees for reason of age. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any Implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- 4. Disabilities. In accordance with section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, 29 U.S.C. § 794, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 12101 et seq., the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 4151 et seq., and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees that it will not discriminate against individuals on the basis of disability. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- 5. Promoting Free Speech and Religious Liberty. The Contractor shall ensure that Federal funding is expended in full accordance with the U.S. Constitution, Federal Law, and statutory and public policy requirements: including, but not limited to, those protecting free speech, religious liberty, public welfare, the environment, and prohibiting discrimination. - (3) The contractor will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the contractor's legal duty to furnish information.
- (4) The contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided by the agency contracting officer, advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under section 202 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- (5) The contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.

- (8) The contractor will include the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The applicant further agrees that it will be bound by the above equal opportunity clause with respect to its own employment practices when it participates in federally assisted construction work: Provided, That if the applicant so participating is a State or local government, the above equal opportunity clause is not applicable to any agency, instrumentality or subdivision of such government which does not participate in work on or under the contract.

The applicant agrees that it will assist and cooperate actively with the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor in obtaining the compliance of contractors and subcontractors with the equal opportunity clause and the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor, that it will furnish the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor such information as they may require for the supervision of such compliance, and that it will otherwise assist the administering agency in the discharge of the agency's primary responsibility for securing compliance.

The applicant further agrees that it will refrain from entering into any contract or contract modification subject to Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, with a contractor debarred from, or who has not demonstrated eligibility for, Government contracts and federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to the Executive Order and will carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the equal opportunity clause as may be imposed upon contractors and subcontractors by the administering agency or the Secretary of Labor pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of the Executive Order. In addition, the applicant agrees that if it fails or refuses to comply with these undertakings, the administering agency may take any or all of the following actions: Cancel, terminate, or suspend in whole or in part this grant (contract, loan, insurance, guarantee); refrain from extending any further assistance to the applicant under the program with respect to which the failure or refund occurred until satisfactory assurance of future compliance has been received from such applicant; and refer the case to the Department of Justice for appropriate legal proceedings.

Incorporation of Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Terms. The preceding provisions include, in part, certain Standard Terms and Conditions required by DOT, whether or not expressly set forth in the preceding contract provisions. All contractual provisions required by DOT, as set forth in FTA Circular 4220.1F, are hereby incorporated by reference. Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, all FTA mandated terms shall be deemed to control in the event of a conflict with other provisions contained in this Agreement. The Contractor shall not perform any act, fail to perform any act, or refuse to comply with any Authority requests which would cause the Authority to be in violation of the FTA terms and conditions.

<u>Energy Conservation.</u> To the extent applicable to the services to be performed by Contractor hereunder, Contractor shall comply with the mandatory energy efficiency standards and policies within the applicable state energy conservation plans issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (42 U.S.C.§ 6201).

Cargo Preference

The contractor agrees:

a. to use privately owned United States-Flag commercial vessels to ship at least 50 percent of any equipment, materials or commodities procured, contracted for or otherwise obtained with funds granted, guaranteed, loaned, or advanced by the U.S. Government under this agreement, and which may be transported by ocean vessel, shall be transported on privately owned United States-flag commercial vessels, if available. 46 U.S.C. § 55305, and U.S. Maritime Administration regulations, "Cargo Preference – U.S.-Flag Vessels," 46 CFR Part 381.

b. to furnish within 20 days following the date of loading for shipments originating within the United States or within 30 working days following the date of loading for shipments originating outside the United States, a legible copy of a rated, 'onboard' commercial ocean bill-of-lading in English for each shipment of cargo described in 46 CFR § 381.7(a)(1) shall be furnished to both the recipient (through the prime contractor in the case of subcontractor bills-of-lading) and to the Division of National Cargo, Office of Market Development, Maritime Administration, Washington, DC 20590; and

c. to include these requirements in all subcontracts issued pursuant to this contract when the subcontract may involve the transport of equipment, material, or commodities by ocean vessel.

<u>Disadvantaged Business Enterprise.</u> The Authority has adopted a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise and Women's Business Enterprise Policy in accordance with Federal Regulations issued by U.S. DOT (49 C.F.R. Part 26). This Policy provides that Disadvantaged Business Enterprises ("DBEs") and Women's Business Enterprises ("WBEs") will be afforded every practicable opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts related to the Authority's construction, procurement and professional service activities. The Contractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. Contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 C.F.R. part 26 in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts. Failure by the contractor to carryout these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as the recipient deems appropriate, which may include, but is not limited to:

- Withholding monthly progress payments;
- Assessing sanctions;
- 3. Liquidated damages; and/or
- 4. Disqualifying the contractor from future bidding as non-responsible. 49 C.F.R. §26.13(b)

The Contractor is required to pay its Subcontractor/Vendors performing work related to this contract for satisfactory performance of that work no later than 30 days after the Contractor's receipt of payment for that work from the Authority. In addition, is required to return any retainage payments to those Subcontractor/Vendors within 30 days after the Subcontractor/Vendor's work related to this contract is satisfactorily completed.

<u>ADA Access.</u> To the extent applicable to the services to be performed by Contractor hereunder, the contractor agrees to comply with all applicable requirements of section 504 of the

Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, 29 U.S.C. § 794, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of handicaps, with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), as amended, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 et seq., which requires that accessible facilities and services be made available to persons with disabilities, including any subsequent amendments to that Act, and with the Architectural Barriers act of 1968, as amended, 42 U.S.C. §§ 4151 et seq., which requires that buildings and public accommodations be accessible to persons with disabilities, including any subsequent amendments to that Act. In addition, the contractor agrees to comply with any and all applicable requirements issued by the FTA, DOT, DOJ, U.S. GSA, U.S. EEOC, U.S. FCC, any subsequent amendments thereto and any other nondiscrimination statute(s) that may apply to the Project.

Safe Operation of Motor Vehicles.

<u>Seat Belt Use.</u> The Contractor is encouraged to adopt and promote on-the-job seat belt use policies and programs for its employees and other personnel that operate company-owned vehicles, company rented vehicles, or personally operated vehicles. The terms "company-owned" and "company-leased" refer to vehicles owned or leased either by the Contractor.

<u>Distracted Driving.</u> The Contractor agrees to adopt and enforce workplace safety policies to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers, including policies to ban text messaging while using an electronic device supplied by an employer, and driving a vehicle the driver owns or rents, a vehicle Contactor owns, leases, or rents, or a privately-owned vehicle when on official business in connection with the work performed under this agreement.

Termination Provisions.

Termination for Convenience.

The Authority shall have the right to terminate the Agreement for convenience, in accordance with 2 C.F.R. §200.339. Any termination for convenience by the Authority shall not excuse the Authority's obligations under the Agreement arising prior to the effective date of such termination.

Termination for Default (Breach or Cause).

If the Contractor does not deliver supplies in accordance with the contract delivery schedule, or if the contract is for services, the Contractor fails to perform in the manner called for in the contract, or if the Contractor fails to comply with any other provisions of the contract, the Authority may terminate this contract for default. Termination shall be affected by serving a Notice of Termination on the Contractor setting forth the manner in which the Contractor is in default. The Contractor will be paid only the contract price for supplies delivered and accepted, or services performed in accordance with the manner of performance set forth in the contract.

If it is later determined by the Authority that the Contractor had an excusable reason for not performing, such as a strike, fire, or flood, events which are not the fault of or are beyond the control of the Contractor, the Authority, after setting up a new delivery of performance

schedule, may allow the Contractor to continue work, or treat the termination as a Termination for Convenience.

Opportunity to Cure.

The Authority, in its sole discretion may, in the case of a termination for breach or default, allow the Contractor an appropriately short period of time in which to cure the defect. In such case, the Notice of Termination will state the time period in which cure is permitted and other appropriate conditions.

If Contractor fails to remedy to NNEPRA's satisfaction the breach or default of any of the terms, covenants, or conditions of this Contract within 10 days after receipt by Contractor of written notice from the Authority setting forth the nature of said breach or default, the Authority shall have the right to terminate the contract without any further obligation to Contractor. Any such termination for default shall not in any way operate to preclude the Authority from also pursuing all available remedies against Contractor and its sureties for said breach or default.

Waiver of Remedies for any Breach.

In the event that the Authority elects to waive its remedies for any breach by Contractor of any covenant, term or condition of this contract, such waiver by the Authority shall not limit the Authority's remedies for any succeeding breach of that or of any other covenant, term, or condition of this contract.

Contractor recognizes and agrees that the FTA may suspend or terminate the Project for various reasons set forth in the Master Agreement at Section 11, that such termination may act to cancel or invalidate certain obligations incurred by FTA prior to the termination date, and that such Termination may act to relieve the Authority of such obligations as well.

<u>Termination for Default (Construction).</u>

If the Contractor refuses or fails to prosecute the work or any separable part, with the diligence that will ensure its completion within the time specified in this contract or any extension or fails to complete the work within this time, or if the Contractor fails to comply with any other provision of this contract, Agency may terminate this contract for default. The Agency shall terminate by delivering to the Contractor a Notice of Termination specifying the nature of the default. In this event, the Agency may take over the work and compete it by contract or otherwise, and may take possession of and use any materials, appliances, and plant on the work site necessary for completing the work. The Contractor and its sureties shall be liable for any damage to the Agency resulting from the Contractor's refusal or failure to complete the work within specified time, whether or not the Contractor's right to proceed with the work is terminated. This liability includes any increased costs incurred by the Agency in completing the work.

The Contractor's right to proceed shall not be terminated nor shall the Contractor be charged with damages under this clause if: 1. The delay in completing the work arises from unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor.

Examples of such causes include: acts of God, acts of Agency, acts of another contractor in the performance of a contract with Agency, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes; and 2. The Contractor, within [10] days from the beginning of any delay, notifies Agency in writing of the causes of delay. If, in the judgment of Agency, the delay is excusable, the time for completing the work shall be extended. The judgment of Agency shall be final and conclusive for the parties, but subject to appeal under the Disputes clause(s) of this contract. 3. If, after termination of the Contractor's right to proceed, it is determined that the Contractor was not in default, or that the delay was excusable, the rights and obligations of the parties will be the same as if the termination had been issued for the convenience of Agency.

Suspension and Debarment. The Contractor shall comply and facilitate compliance with U.S. DOT regulations, "Nonprocurement Suspension and Debarment," 2 C.F.R. part 1200, which adopts and supplements the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (U.S. OMB) "Guidelines to Agencies on Governmentwide Debarment and Suspension (Nonprocurement)," 2 C.F.R. part 180. These provisions apply to each contract at any tier of \$25,000 or more, and to each contract at any tier for a federally required audit (irrespective of the contract amount), and to each contract at any tier that must be approved by an FTA official irrespective of the contract amount. As such, the Contractor shall verify that its principals, affiliates, and subcontractors are eligible to participate in this federally funded contract and are not presently declared by any Federal department or agency to be:

- a) Debarred from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- b) Suspended from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- c) Proposed for debarment from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- d) Declared ineligible to participate in any federally assisted Award;
- e) Voluntarily excluded from participation in any federally assisted Award; or
- f) Disqualified from participation in ay federally assisted Award.

By signing and submitting its bid or proposal, the bidder or proposer certifies as follows:

The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact relied upon by the Authority. If it is later determined by the Authority that the bidder or proposer knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, in addition to remedies available to the Authority, the Federal Government may pursue available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment. The bidder or proposer agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. part 180, subpart C, as supplemented by 2 C.F.R. part 1200, while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any contract that may arise from this offer. The bidder or proposer further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.

<u>Prevailing Wage and Copeland Anti-Kickback Acts.</u> The Contractor shall comply with the Davis-Bacon Act and the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act. Under 49 U.S.C. § 5333(a), prevailing wage protections apply to laborers and mechanics employed on FTA assisted construction, alteration,

or repair projects. The Contractor will comply with the Davis-Bacon Act, 40 U.S.C. §§ 3141-3144, and 3146-3148 as supplemented by DOL regulations at 29 C.F.R. part 5, "Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Contracts Governing Federally Financed and Assisted Construction." In accordance with the statute, the Contractor shall pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the prevailing wages specified in a wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, the Contractor agrees to pay wages not less than once a week.

The Contractor shall also comply with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. § 3145), as supplemented by DOL regulations at 29 C.F.R. part 3, "Contractors and Subcontractors on Public Building or Public Work Financed in Whole or in part by Loans or Grants from the United States." The Contractor is prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he or she is otherwise entitled.

<u>Recovered Materials.</u> The Contractor agrees to comply with all the requirements of Section 6002 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), as amended (42 U.S.C. 6962), including but not limited to the regulatory provisions of 40 CFR Part 247, and Executive Order 12873, as they apply to the procurement of the items designated in Subpart B of 40 CFR Part 247.

<u>Veteran's Preference/Employment.</u> The Contractor shall give hiring preference, to the extent practicable, to veterans (as defined in section 2108 of title 5) who have the requisite skills and abilities to perform the construction work required under the contract. This shall not be understood, construed or enforced in any manner that would require the Contractor to giver preference to any veteran over any equally qualified applicant who is a member of any racial or ethnic minority, female, an individual with a disability, or former employee.

Prohibition on Certain Telecommunications and Video Surveillance Services of Equipment.

- a. Recipients and subrecipients are prohibited from obligating or expending loan or grant funds to:
 - 1. Procure or obtain;
 - 2. Extend or renew a contract to procure or obtain; or
 - 3. Enter into a contract (or extend or renew a contract) to procure or obtain equipment, services, or systems that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system. As described in Public Law 115232, section 889, covered telecommunications equipment is telecommunications equipment produced by Huawei Technologies Company or ZTE Corporation (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities).

Telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by an entity that the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Director of the National Intelligence or the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reasonably believes to be an entity owned or controlled by, or otherwise connected to, the government of a covered foreign country.
- b. In implementing the prohibition under Public Law 115232, section 889, subsection (f), paragraph (1), heads of executive agencies administering loan, grant, or subsidy programs shall prioritize available funding and technical support to assist affected businesses, institutions and organizations as is reasonably necessary for those affected entities to transition from covered communications equipment and services, to procure replacement equipment and services, and to ensure that communications service to users and customers is sustained.

Canopy Removal at Portland Transportation Center Construction Specifications

General Information

- 1. The work of this Contract generally includes removal of the existing fiberglass canopy over the station platform and other associated work at the Portland Transportation Center. The work includes, but is not limited to, the following elements:
 - a. Mobilizing to the site and demobilizing from the site.
 - b. Supplying and maintaining barrier devices for partial closure of the passenger platform while construction is occurring.
 - c. Removing and properly disposing of the existing fiberglass canopy and steel spline members supporting the canopy. After removal of the existing canopy, a cap shall be installed on the top of each of the existing support columns.
 - d. Adjusting the existing light fixtures attached to the existing canopy support columns.
 - e. Rerouting and installing support for the existing flexible conduit that contains video camera data cable that currently extends from the trainway roof, across the top of the canopy, and down to the video camera that is attached to the adjacent supporting column for the existing canopy.

All work shall be done in accordance with these specifications and the attached figures.

- 2. The Figures consist of Canopy Removal Figure; Aerial Location Map; site plan reference drawings; and cut sheets of existing elements.
 - Note that some Figures are annotated versions of the Contract Plans or catalog cut sheets from the original construction of the platform and may vary from the actual configuration. The Contractor is responsible for reviewing the existing conditions prior to submitting their quote.
- 3. All work shall conform to the 2020 MaineDOT Standard Specifications, as updated through the date the Request for Quotes was issued, except as noted in these specifications.
- 4. The Contractor shall phase the work such that sections of the platform remain useable during construction. The Contractor shall submit a phasing plan to NNEPRA for approval prior to construction. The Contractor shall place appropriate signage and barricades at each work area to prevent the public from accessing areas under construction. The proposed signage and barricades shall be shown in the phasing plan. All costs for preparing the phasing plan and placing signage and barricades shall be included in the Mobilization/ Demobilization item.
- 5. The Contractor shall submit a proposed construction access plan for approval prior to the start of construction. Any access across the tracks will need to be approved by CSX. Any disturbance caused by access and work activities shall be restored to preconstruction conditions at the Contractor's expense. All costs for preparing the construction access plan shall be included in the Mobilization/ Demobilization item.

- 6. The Contractor shall pause all work while Downeaster trains are at the Station platform or while CSX freight trains are passing the siding. A CSX flagger will be on-site during construction and all work stoppages shall be as directed by the flagger. A Downeaster schedule is available at https://amtrakdowneaster.com/schedule/. Freight trains may pass at any time but generally, approximately 1-2 freight trains per week will pass by the station.
- 7. The Contractor shall coordinate all access to the project area with NNEPRA and CSX's flagger.
- 8. The Contractor shall not access the adjacent railroad ROW without explicit permission from CSX.

Mobilization/Demobilization

- 1. At the beginning of the project, the Contractor shall mobilize to the site in accordance with the requirements of MaineDOT Standard Specification Item 659.10 Mobilization.
- 2. At the conclusion of the project, the Contractor shall demobilize all equipment, unused material and personnel from the job site. Additionally, the Contractor shall restore the site to the existing conditions, as directed by NNEPRA.
- 3. All required work for mobilizing and demobilizing, including but not limited to, all labor, equipment, materials, professional services, and incidentals for the work shall be included in the lump sum cost quoted for "Mobilization/ Demobilization".

Removing and Disposing the Existing Fiberglass Canopy

- 1. The Contractor shall remove the existing fiberglass canopy. Additionally, the Contractor shall remove the existing steel support members that are welded to the top of the support columns that support the canopy. The canopy and steel spline support members shall be disposed of in accordance with all Local and State regulations.
- 2. After removal of the canopy, the Contractor shall install caps on top of the existing support columns to prevent water intrusion. The caps shall be round cone piling caps from Dock Builders Supply, or an approved equal (https://www.dockbuilders.com/shop-by-category/dock-accessories/piling-caps/round-cone-piling-caps.html). The Contractor shall measure the outside diameter of the existing support columns and determine the appropriate size cap. The caps shall be secured to the columns using mechanical fasteners or an appropriate adhesive, at the Contractor's option.
- 3. All required work for the removal and disposal of the existing fiberglass canopy and installation of caps on the existing support columns, including but not limited to, all labor, equipment, and materials shall be included in the lump sum cost for "Removal and Disposal of Existing Canopy".

Adjusting Existing Light Fixtures

1. This work shall consist of adjusting the existing light fixtures that are attached to the canopy support columns. The existing light fixtures currently face upwards. After removal of the existing canopy, the Contractor shall rotate the light fixtures so that they


face downwards towards the platform and mechanically secure them in the new orientation. The catalog cut sheets for the existing light fixtures are included with this procurement.


- 2. The existing light fixture facing the ramp at the east end of the platform furthest from the trainway shall remain and modifications to that light fixture are not required.
- 3. All required work for adjusting the existing light fixtures, including but not limited to, all labor, equipment, materials, and incidentals for the work shall be included in the lump sum for "Adjustment of Existing Light Fixtures".





- All required work for rerouting and supporting the existing flexible conduit and wire for the camera, including but not limited to, all labor, equipment, materials, and incidentals for the work shall be included in the lump sum for "Support Flexible Conduit to Camera".









All modules are factory prewired with a quick-disconnect plug for mating to the ballast. Available in three light distributions, all interchangeable within the same housing.

Wall Grazer Reflector Module: Specular Alzak® optical segment is rigidly formed into a self-contained module which attaches to the housing by a no-tool quick-disconnecting hinge and fastener. Black anodized louver vanes run parallel to the lamp arc for controlling the hot spot directly behind the fixture, and spill light into the atmosphere. For WD14 models all sockets are porcelain medium base rated 4KV. For WD18 models all sockets are porcelain mogul base with HPS rated at 4KV, and MH versions having pin-oriented sockets with molded silicone lamp stabilizers. Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all

rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

State Adopted Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SA"" identifier indicate that the prevailing wage rate set by a state (or local) government was adopted under 29 C.F.R •1.3(g)-(h). Example: SAME2023-007 01/03/2024. SA reflects that the rates are state adopted. ME refers to the State of Maine. 2023 is the year during which the state completed the survey on which the listed classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 01/03/2024 reflects the date on which the classifications and rates under the ?SA? identifier took effect under state law in the state from which the rates were adopted.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

- 1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:
- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour National Office because National Office has responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
